



Winter Report -January 11th, 2025

Greetings to all and a Happy New Year!

As I anticipate what 2025 has in store for us, I stop to pause and thankfully regard what we have accomplished so far.

Sacred Music Academy (SMA) has succeeded in changing the lives of many young people through music. Almost every SMA student had never sung or held their instrument prior to being admitted. And yet - already, all intermediate through advanced students are playing their instruments and singing with considerable proficiency and are frequently involved in performance opportunities outside of our organization. There is something in the way that they hold themselves... a spark of confidence and inspiration, brought about by the knowledge that their hard work has yielded them a special skill that will last for a lifetime. Additionally, the students find validation and joyful camaraderie in pursuing music studies alongside others who are doing the same. Some are even showing enough passion and skill so in a few years, pursuing music studies at major university music programs may be an option for them.


Meanwhile, Sacred Music Academy continues to expand. We are currently serving 80 students ages 4-18. We now have so many students that SMA recitals cannot realistically include all students in a single performance, so future recitals will need to be split into separate events on different days. Options for our students include Kindermusik, choir, beginner and intermediate orchestra, violin, cello, voice, piano and organ. Also, Dr. Mimi Zhang (Doctor of Music) has joined our strings faculty, and her information can be found on our website.

In summer of 2025, we will be reconsidered for funding to see if the program will continue. Within that time frame, our goals include making sure that our students continue to grow in confidence, ownership and enjoyment in their musical areas of study. We are positioned to expand and extend the program by tiered skill levels, instruments and ensembles. Truly, the sky is the limit, although I am thankful and satisfied with our results as they currently stand.

We are continuously thankful to the parishioners who lavish us with their dedication and Memorial Presbyterian's famous hospitality. This has been a key component to the program, and if you would like to donate your time on Mondays from 3:30pm-7pm (or somewhere within that timeframe), please contact me. We are looking for more volunteers to help chaperone, guide students to their classes, and sit in with teachers while they teach.

On behalf of our 80 students and their families, I thank you all from the bottom of my heart for opening your special and beautiful church and grounds to this ministry.


