The Curious Love Language of Ted Lasso: Join us on February 9, 9:30 - 10:30 a.m. in Lewis Hall. Special Guest Molly Phelps will be leading us in a workshop. Utilizing Dr. Marshall Rosenberg's principles of Nonviolent Communication (NVC), participants in this seminar will learn the skills of empathetic listening and responding through the practice of the "Observations, Feelings, Needs and Requests" NVC model. Using clips from the award-winning television show, Ted Lasso, participants will learn how to practice the NVC art and love language of "Be Curious, Not Judgmental." Participants will also utilize their own communication challenges to reframe past conflicts using a NVC model grounded in empathy and connection. Dr. Marshall Rosenberg, the late founder of the Nonviolent Communication method, successfully utilized NVC strategies in war torn places around the world, transforming the communities of Northern Ireland and Rwanda.

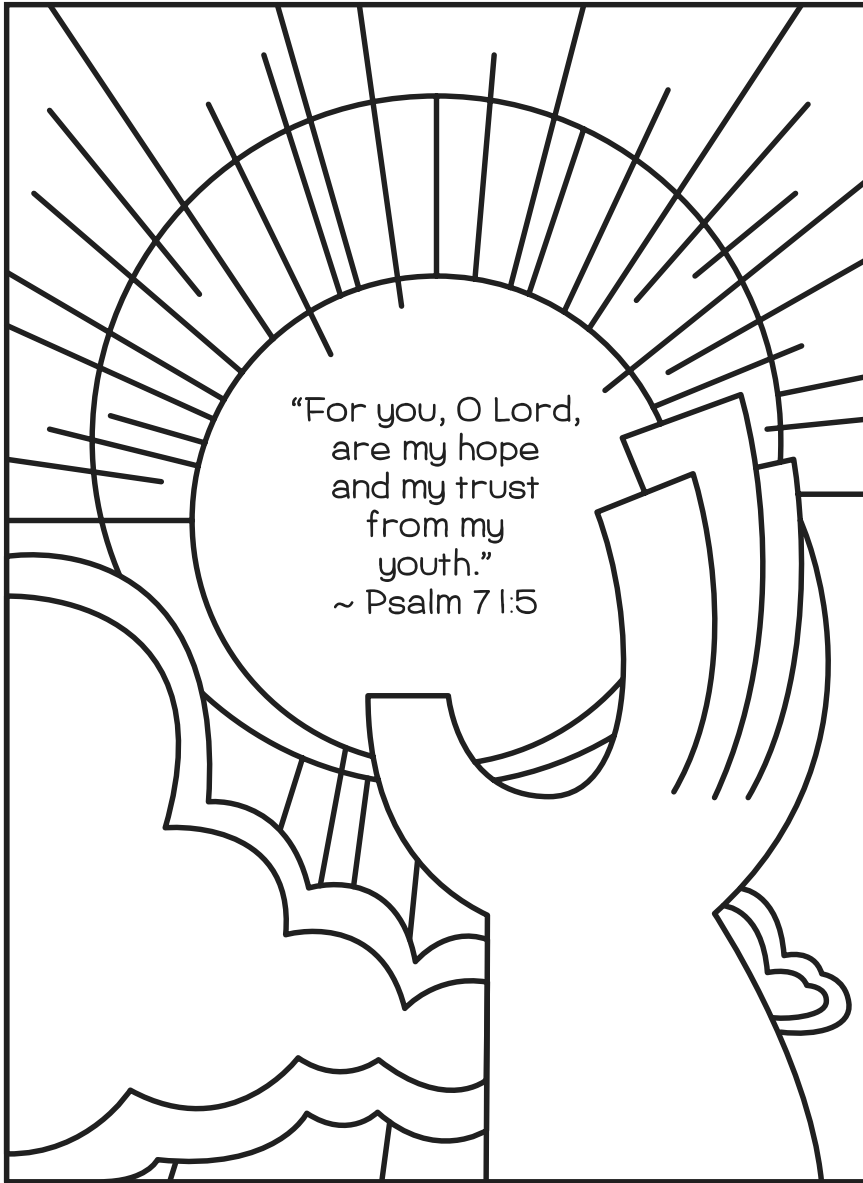
