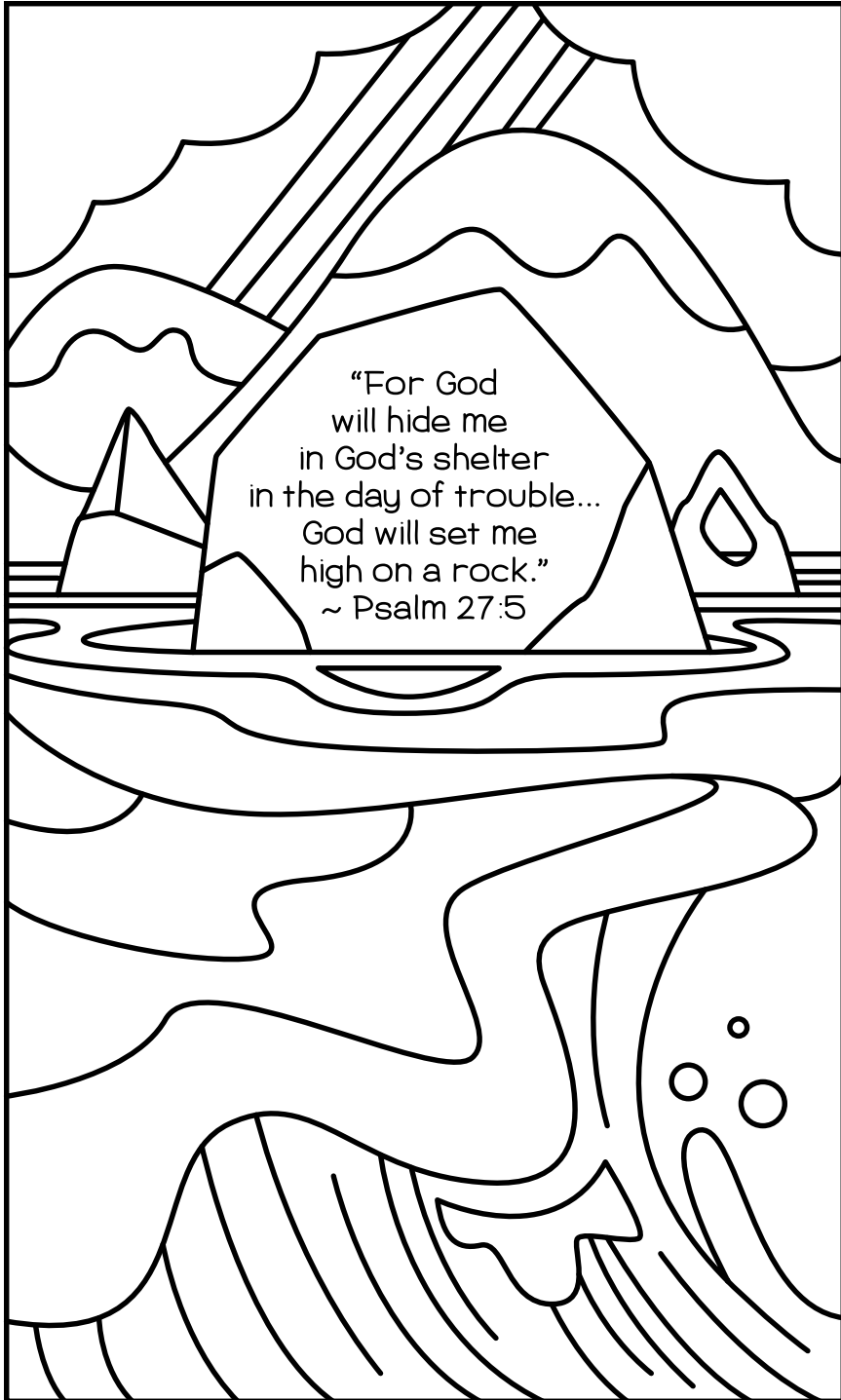

Margo Currie, has been a Presbyterian for 76 years, being baptized at 6 weeks old in her home by her pastor from a Mission Church of Woodlawn Pres. because she had a cold. Every time her family moved in Beaver County (located in mid-western PA); they would attend a different Presbyterian church. 1st Mission Church of Woodlawn Pres., 2nd Woodlawn Pres., 3rd Mt. Carmel Pres., 4th North Branch Pres.

Margo graduated from Edinboro University in PA with a B.S. in Art Education and M.S. Ed. In Educational Psychology. She is the wife of Ed Currie, a psychologist who continues to have private practice in Beaver PA. They have one daughter, Helene, and three grandchildren: Joey (17), Angelina (10), Helena (9). Many of you may know Joey because of his friendly smile and demeanor, where he frequently hands out wooden crosses as part of his ministry.

Her passion for art led to a career teaching art to grades K-12 in the Beaver Area School District for 35 years. She also taught art/crafts at North Branch VBS for several years. Also, during her time at North Branch Pres., she would create the publicity poster for the churches "Night of Broadway" musical performances. Her artwork would then be hung in the hall for all to admire. Other gifts she has given to churches were Sunday School Teacher, Elder, and she prepared many church dinners to help support the ministry and youth programs of the church.

2005 she moved to St. Augustine and began attending Memorial Pres. She has been a deacon for six years, a member of the deacon's reception team serving attendees at events such as funerals. She was the secretary of Presbyterian Women Coordinating Team from 2020 - 2024 and attends Mary Circle, Feast, and has provided food for Dining with Dignity.

Louise Dunnavan is the 2025 recipient of the PW Life Membership Award. A native Floridian, Louise was born in Madison FL. She attended Florida State University, getting her degree in Home Economics Education (The current terminology is Family & Consumer Science.) She was raised a Southern Baptist, but her college roommate was Presbyterian, and they enjoyed attending each other's churches. Eventually, she fell in love with the Presbyterian traditions. After College she moved to New Jersey and was married for 33 years. She worshiped at Union Presbyterian Church in Carneys Point, New Jersey and was a member for 35 years.

She involved herself fully in the church and served in several capacities: Deacon, Elder, Sunday School Teacher, Youth Group Leader, served on the Sacraments & Services Committee where the tradition was to serve homemade bread. She baked communion bread for every service for 21 years! She was also a PW Circle Co-leader and served on two Presbytery committees in the Presbytery of West Jersey. She taught Home Economics for 27 years in the public schools at 2 High schools in Salem County, NJ and was a County 4H Agent for 4 years.

Upon retirement in 2000, she purchased a condo in St. Augustine and realized her dream of living close to the ocean! She joined MPC and served as Deacon for 2 years. During this time, she worked at St. Francis Inn as an Innkeeper.

As luck would have it, in 2002, she went back to her home church in NJ to attend a graduation ceremony for an adult woman she had mentored, and she met Roger Dunnavan who was their new pastor. Seeing a future with him, she moved back to NJ, and they married in 2005 and lived in Carneys Point, NJ until their move to St. Augustine in 2017.

Louise jumped right back into the work of the church and served on the Music & Worship Committee. You still see her friendly face when she ushers or serves as a greeter. Here she used her sewing & teaching skills to teach others to make the personal hygiene bags and kits sent around the globe. Louise was Co-Circle leader of Deborah Circle for 5 years and then for from 2022 – 2024 she served PW as the Coordinator/Facilitator.

When asked what Presbyterian Women means to her, she said: "PW is an important part of my life. I have been mentored by many dedicated Presbyterian Women in my faith journey. I love to mentor others in the faith and share in the fellowship and the wonderful Bible Studies. It gives me a tremendous sense of belonging."
