9:30 – 10:30 a.m.

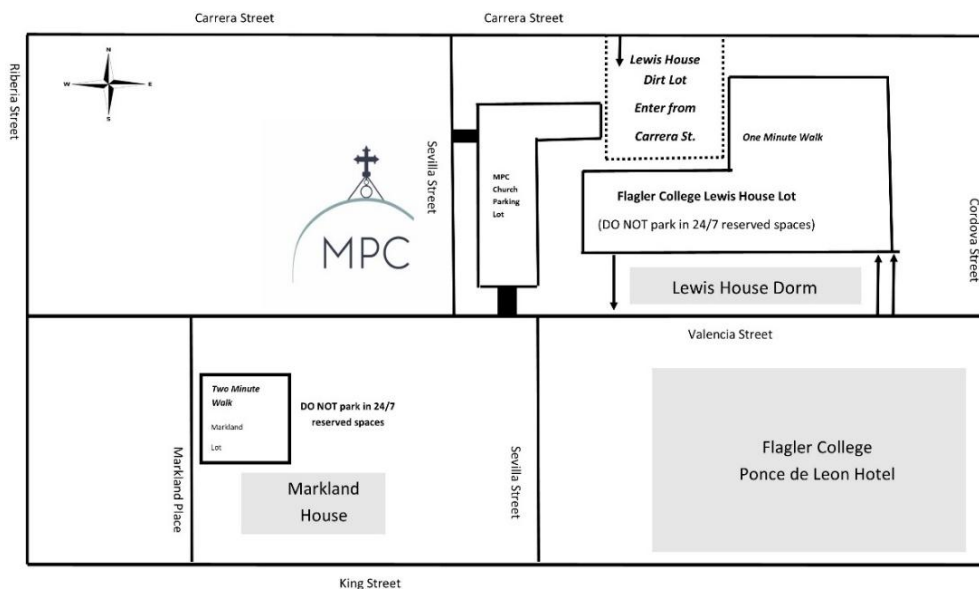

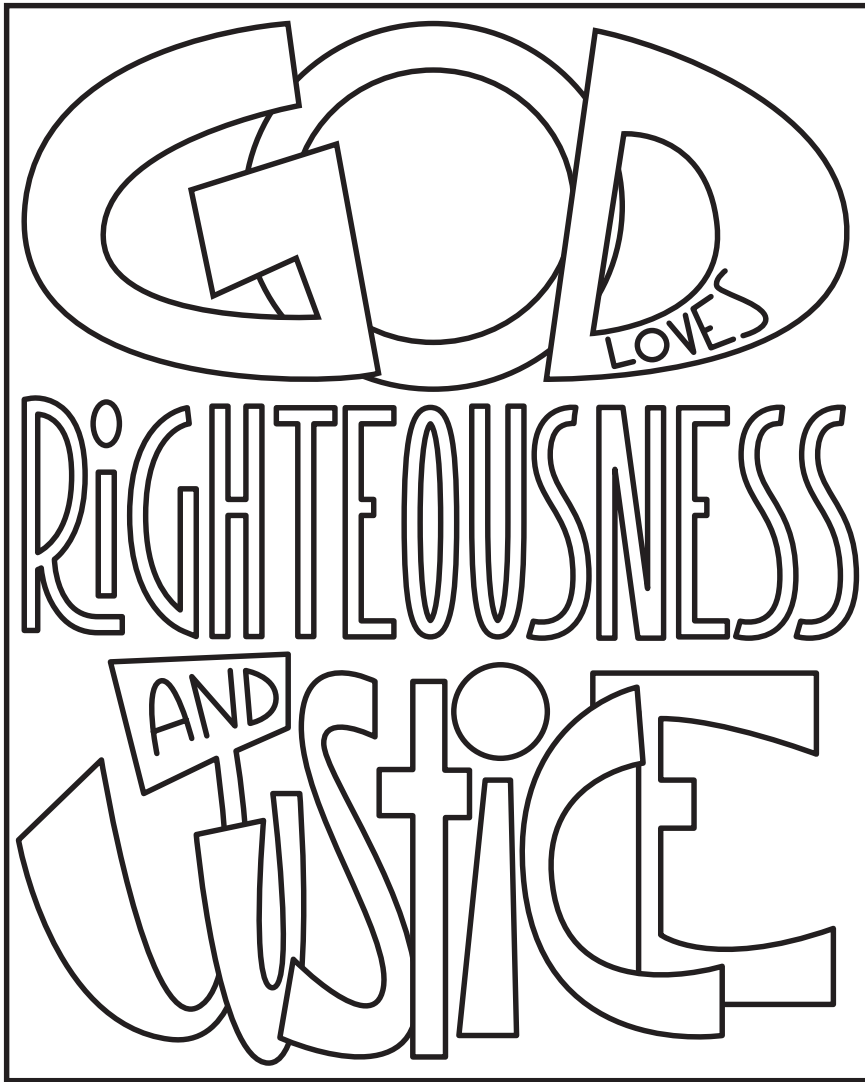

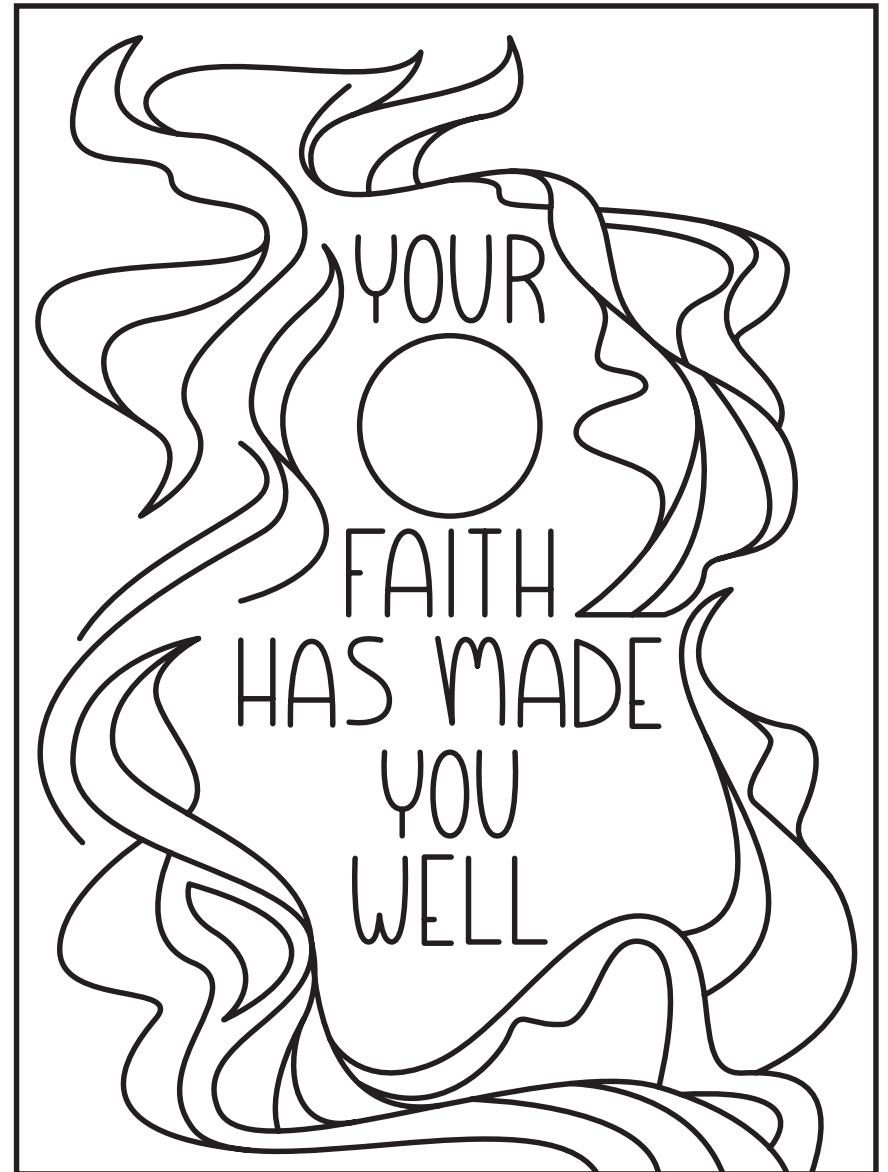

DRAW IT
