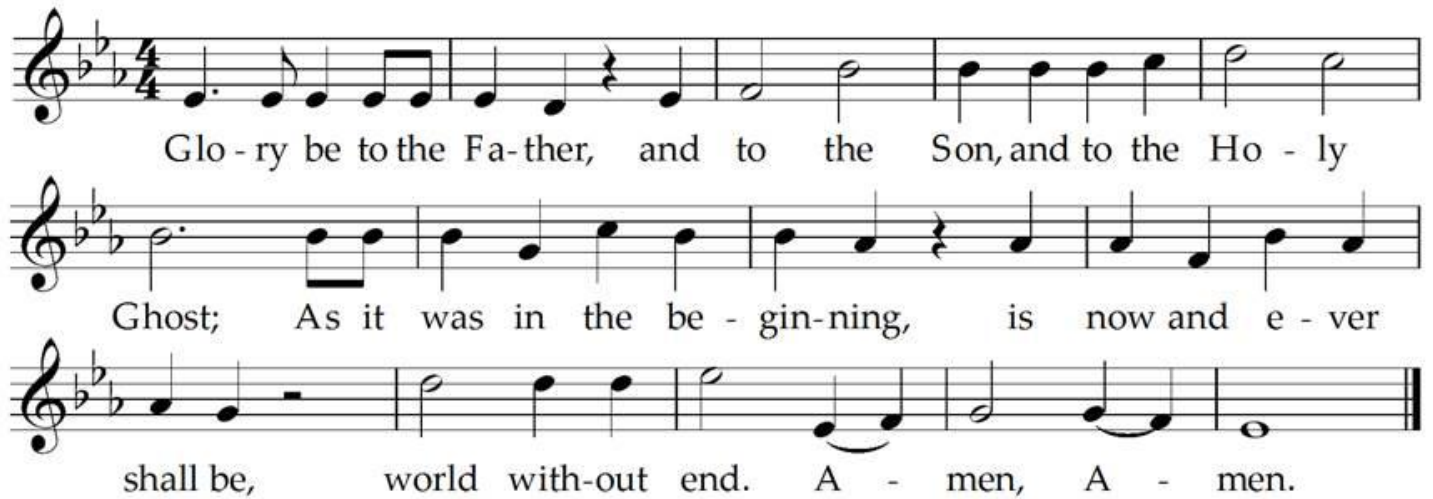

9:30 – 10:30 a.m.

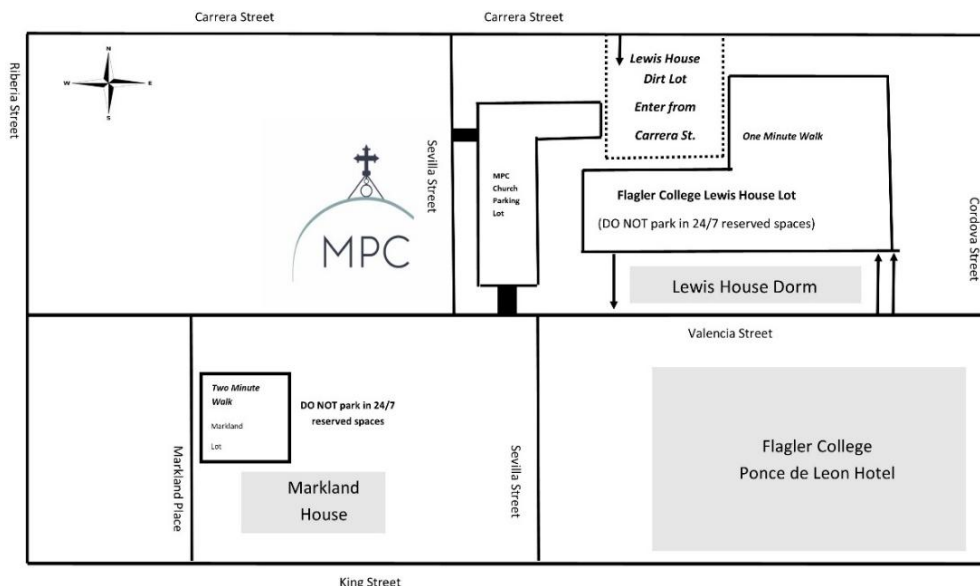

Supplies Needed at Wildflower Clinic: From Sunday, July 5 through Sunday, July 12, bins will be placed on the office porch for supplies needed at the Wildflower Clinic. They provide free medical and dental care to uninsured, low-income adults in St. Johns County. Items needed are: postage stamps, Keurig coffee K-Cups (volunteers love this!), water in small individual bottles, individually wrapped candy (for volunteers, staff, outreach and medical), pens (blue, black, red), toilet paper, paper towels, printer paper, sticky notes, 33-gallon trash bags, Ziplock sandwich bags, bug spray, individually wrapped toothbrushes, emergency foil blankets, bathing wipes, hand warmers, Chapstick/lip balm. If you know of anyone over 18 without medical or dental insurance who lives in St. Johns County, have them call the clinic at 904-829-1962 to see if they qualify for free healthcare.

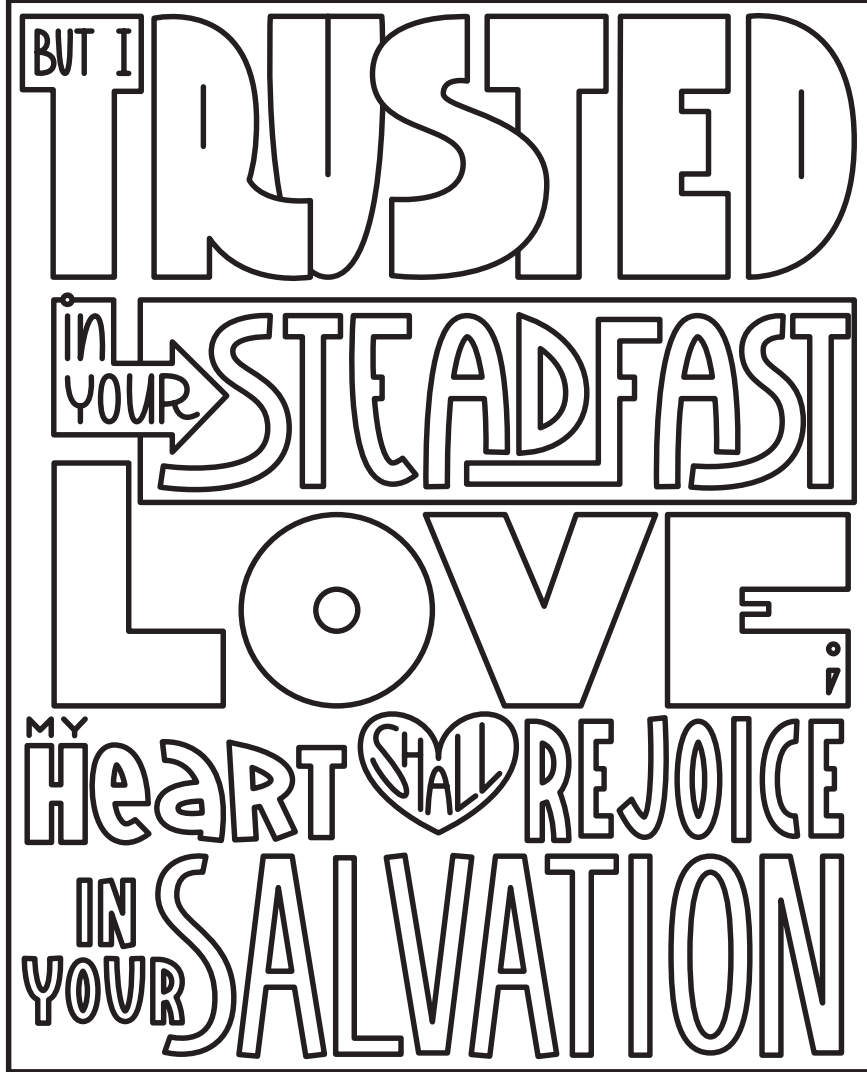

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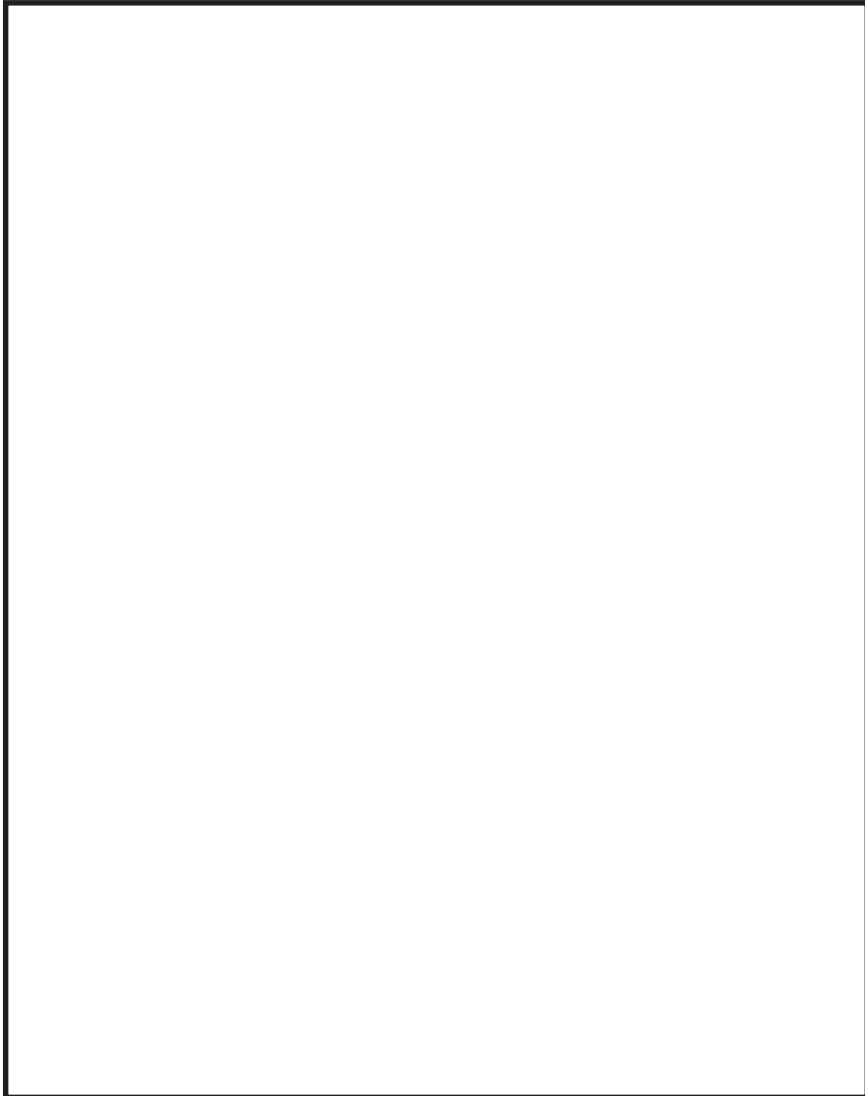
